DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE & FOOD

SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS – CATTLE

Animal Health Status

T.B.

All animals must come from herds, which are not restricted, and the herd and relevant animals must have had a clear test within the previous twelve months. No pre-movement test is required for T.B., however it is recommended by the Department that a 30-day pre-movement test for TB should apply to all Shows.

Brucellosis

- (a) All animals must come from herds which are not restricted.
- (b) Certain animals (i.e. females aged 24 months and over and bulls aged 24 months and over) must have passed a test for Brucellosis within the previous 60 days. However, these animals may move to any number of Shows within the validity period of the same 60-day pre-movement test.

Where such an animal(s) is/are being shown repeatedly during successive 60-day validity periods, in the course of a Show season, the animal(s) may be allowed to move on foot of Permit ER 36A during the unexpired portion of a valid test where the animal is under test for the next validity period and the identity card/passport is held by the DVO/practitioner.

Identification

All cattle must bear double plastic tags as issued under the Department's identification system. They must be accompanied by their passports (except in the circumstances outlined in the preceding sub-paragraph).

Bulls for A.I. Stations

In addition to the T.B. and Brucellosis tests, bulls destined for A.I. stations must be tested for I.B.R. (Infectious Bovine Rhinotracheitis), E.B.L. (Enzootic Bovine Leukosis), B.V.D. (Bovine Virus Diarrhoea) and Johnes Disease, within 30 days prior to movement into such stations.

AIM notification

The movement of Irish-registered cattle to and from an Agricultural Show within the State must be recorded on AIM using form CMMS 4 (available from local DVOs). Ultimate responsibility for fulfilling this requirement lies with the Show Secretary.

The keeper of the animal(s) should complete sections 2 and 3(a) of the CMMS 4 form while Section 3(b) should be completed by the Show Secretary. Completed forms should be sent to the District Veterinary Office in the county where the Show is being held within 7 days of movement.

The I.S.A. would advise all animal owners who have their animals insured to have the cover extended to cover them while showing animals at shows.

DISCIPLINE

The Irish Shows Association expects and will insist upon appropriate behaviour from all Exhibitors and others participating in any of the activities at our Member Shows and will not tolerate inappropriate behaviour.

Inappropriate behaviour shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- Profanity, coarse or vulgar language or gestures towards judges or other Show officials.
- Harassment or bullying, including using words or actions that threaten, intimidate or undermine judges or other officials before, during or following Member Show activities.
- Failure to follow rules and/or obey instructions.
- Abusing any animal.

Disciplinary Procedures:

Complaints of misconduct against an Exhibitor or other participant at a Member Show shall be investigated and adjudicated upon by a subcommittee appointed by the Irish Shows Association. The said subcommittee shall consist of three members of the board of the Irish Shows Association and shall be known as the Disciplinary Committee. The Disciplinary Committee shall seek to ensure the existence of consistent, effective, fair and transparent complaint procedures and shall act in accordance with natural and constitutional justice.

Procedure:

A complaint of misconduct/inappropriate behaviour against an Exhibitor or other participant in a Member Show shall be made in writing and delivered to the Secretary of the relevant Member Show within 72 hours.

A copy of the complaint shall be sent by the Secretary of the Member Show to the National Secretary of the ISA. A copy of the complaint will be sent by the National Secretary to the person or persons against whom the complaint is made. A person or persons against whom a written complaint is made shall have a period of 14 working days from the date of receipt of the claim to reply to the said complaint; such reply shall be made in writing. Both parties shall state whether an oral hearing of the complaint is sought. The Disciplinary Committee shall be entitled to hold an oral hearing in regard to the complaint whether or not sought. The Disciplinary Committee shall decide in each case whether to hold such an oral hearing in respect of the complaint, or any part thereof and there shall be no appeal from such decision of the Disciplinary Committee.

The Disciplinary Committee shall, at any time, seek further information from either party. In the event of either party refusing or failing to provide such further information within the time specified by the Disciplinary Committee, the Committee shall be entitled to make a decision on the complaint and/or to hold an oral hearing of the complaint in the absence of a copy of such further information being received by the Disciplinary Committee from either party.

The Disciplinary Committee shall be entitled to reject a complaint where, in the opinion of the Committee, it finds there is no basis for it.

Sanctions:

In the event of a first incident of inappropriate/unacceptable behaviour being deemed to be proved against the offender, the Disciplinary Committee shall issue a written warning to the offender. In the event of any subsequent incident, the Disciplinary Committee shall be entitled to impose sanctions on the offender, including a prohibition on such offender participating in any of the events/activities at any Member Show of the ISA, provided always that in the event of a first incident of inappropriate / unacceptable behaviour being deemed by the Disciplinary Committee to constitute gross misbehaviour, the Disciplinary Committee shall be entitled to impose such sanctions on the offender as it deems appropriate, including the prohibition on such offender from participating in any of the events/activities of any Member Show of the ISA.

The decision of the Disciplinary Committee shall be final.

Note from ISA:

Winners of qualifiers are themselves responsible for entering the Details of their animals or exhibits for the final in within one hour of qualifying or before they leave the show where they qualify. Winners of qualifiers will only be allowed to compete in the final after they make sure that they have documented all their details for the final. The ISA in conjunction with the sponsor reserve the right to alter or amend the rules of any competition as may be necessary or appropriate.

In line with these changes a specific cert of compliance for the movement of bovine from a single holding to a show must now be requested prior to the movement of animals concerned. These certs can be created by applying online using their agfood account or where the keeper is not online the cert can be generated by the local regional vet office following receipt of a NBAS31K with issue of the cert being subject to normal criteria applicable. This form will be available on the depts website. When applying for this cert the destination herd/show number is not required. The cert generated will include an S symbol. The cert for a show will continue to be valid for 30 days. Calves under 10 days cannot be moved to a show. Certificate must be produced to the show secretary on the day, fully completed with cards.

The Longford Agri Show committee acting by ourselves reserves the right to reject or cancel any entry or entries made by or on behalf of any person, corporate or other entity and may direct the removal of any animal or other exhibit from the showing ring or display area and from the showgrounds if the committee and its agents or officers shall deem it fit to do so, without offering any explanation or reason for so doing and without incurring any liability whatsoever to any such applicant / exhibitor or his or her or its agent.

Important Notice to Animal Owners involved in showing Animals at Shows

Dangerous, wild, unruly, animals are banned from the showgrounds

The Irish Shows Association would advise all Animal owners who have their Animals Insured to have the Insurance cover extended to cover them while showing Animals at Shows, it may cost very little or nothing at all depending on who you have Insurance with. The reason for giving this advice is that if your animal were to injure someone or damage someone's property, and it is established that your animal was out of your control at that time, you may be held responsible or partly responsible for any injury or damage caused, and could end up paying all, or part of any settlement reached.

All consignments of sheep being moved must be accompanied by a completed dispatch document. Individual details of each sheep in the consignment must be recorded on the document. Sheep from non-restricted flocks only can be moved to shows. In the case of flocks restricted following diagnosis of scrapie, sheep possessing the ARR/ARR genotype only may be exhibited. The movement of these ARR/ARR genotype sheep must be accompanied by the relevant movement permit (SCR/10), which can be obtained from the local District Veterinary Office in the county where the flock is located.

AIM Notification

The movement of sheep to and from an Agricultural Show within the State must be recorded on AIM. The show secretary keeps white copy for his/her records.

- (c) Shows must ensure that the qualifiers are held strictly in accordance with the relevant rules.

- (d) No other sponsor may be involved in qualifying classes.

- (e) Shows may charge an entrance fee for each qualifying class. **The I.S.A. will award a rosette to the successful animal(s) on appearance at the Final.**

- (f) **No show hosting a Championship Final may hold a qualifier for that Championship on the day of the Final other than by agreement with the Irish Shows Association.**

- (g) Animals qualified for Finals are **not** eligible to enter in any other class at the Show where the Final is held other than a Qualifying Class for another Competition.

- (h) Shows **should** appoint competent well-briefed persons to act as Stewards, who must ensure that only animals (or other exhibits) which are eligible to compete and those whose documentation is in order are allowed to proceed to the judging ring.

Animal Passports should be read by a Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the show.

On completion of judging, Stewards should instruct the successful competitors to attend at the Show Secretary's Office **within one hour** and to complete the necessary documentation for entry to the championship final.

- (k) The show must appoint a well-briefed officer, who will be in attendance at the Secretary's Office, and who will assist exhibitors to complete the necessary documentation for participation in the final and to collect the relevant entrance fee.

- (l) **Show Secretaries must forward complete result cards, together with appropriate fees to the Irish Shows Association within three (3) days following the holding of the show. N.B. Shows must return results card marked "No Qualifier" for any or all of the events for which no animal (or exhibit) has been selected.**

D. RESPONSIBILITY OF EXHIBITORS

- (d)** The Irish Shows Association, in conjunction with the sponsor, reserve the right to alter or amend the rules of any competition as may be necessary or appropriate.
- (e)** **Shows and competitors must contact the National Irish Shows Office for details of any championships and not the sponsor involved.**
- (f)** Objections must be lodged in writing with the I.S.A. representative at the show or the Show Secretary **within half an hour following the completion of judging**, together with a fee of €50, or other stated fee, which is refundable in the event of the objection being upheld.
- (g)** Any Exhibitor who makes a false declaration or misrepresents a fact regarding themselves or their exhibit are liable to disqualification and or forfeiture of any prizes awarded.

E. RESPONSIBILITIES OF SHOWS HOSTING CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS

- (a)** A deduction of 5% of the prize money is to be collected by the Show and forwarded to the Irish Shows Association within **30 days of the final**.
Championship finals must start **not later than 2pm on the day of the show** and the advertised time of starting **must** be adhered to as far as practicable, if necessary, other show classes should be either postponed or relocated to allow for this.

NOTICES OF INTEREST TO CHAMPIONSHIP PARTICIPANTS

IRISH LAW (EU DIRECTIVE)

Under Irish Law all horses moving from one location to another must be accompanied by their passports. It is in your own interest to ensure this is the case. Failure to do so is an offence under Irish Law and is liable on summary conviction to result in a fine up to €3,000. All passports must be registered with the name of the current owner.

- **Embryo Transfer:** Where a foal is produced by this method the dams passport must bear a declaration dated, stamped and signed by the stallion owner (or accredited practitioner where A.I. is involved) stating the date on which the dam was last covered (or inseminated) and the name of the covering stallion.
